**Dear Parents and Care Givers** 

No doubt parents, along with staff and students all heaved a collective sigh when in-term swimming lessons drew to a close. Thank you all for your co-operation in ensuring that our children had the opportunity to participate in this very important aspect of the school's program. With swimming lessons completed and the term now more than half over, school has settled onto a regular but busy routine. It was a major undertaking – organising and transporting approximately 330 children, with all of their gear, to and from the pool for 9 days, on a very rigid timeline, bit it appeared to all run very smoothly. All participating students should now have brought home their swimming certificates that detailed their progress and achievements during the lessons

The Interschool Carnival will be held at Guildford Grammar School Pool today. We will be competing against other schools of similar size, including several private schools. I wish our competitors every success, expecting that the competition to be very stiff. Thanks to Magda Wright who again donated her time to train the swimming squad before and after school, over the last few weeks.

Last Wednesday, Ruby B and Amy WF represented the school in the HEC Public Speaking competition. The eventual winners came from Mundaring (Junior) and Gidgegannup (Senior). Both of our students acquitted themselves very well.

Last Thursday, the school participated in the local T20 cricket competition. The teams, made up of students from Years 5 and 6 were very successful, with the girls winning their competition and the boys finishing as runners up. Both teams will go on to compete in the regional finals and, if successful, will progress to the state championships. Thanks to Mr Scott, Mr Moran and the students for giving up their lunch breaks to train.

### **Purple Day**

Next Monday, the 26th March, the school will participate in Purple Day, to acknowledge and raise awareness of, the many people who are affected by Epilepsy.

Epilepsy is the most common serious neurological condition in Australia.

- It affects approximately 3.5% of the population in their lifetime. In WA, at least 24,500 people have active Epilepsy with at least a further 1,400 new patients presenting with a seizure each year.
- It can affect anyone at any age, but many people experience their first seizure before the age of twenty.
- One in 20 children will have a seizure at some time during their childhood or adolescence
- The risk of a person developing epilepsy in their lifetime is between 3 and 5%.

We have several students at school who are affected by epilepsy.

On Purple Day, students are encouraged to wear something purple – a ribbon, t shirt, socks, a hat or a badge (or even a Dockers scarf!) and to bring a gold coin to donate to research into Epilepsy.

The money will be collected in each class.



### **School Council Public Meeting**

The School council will conduct its annual Public Meeting on the 9<sup>th</sup> April. In this forum, the Chairperson, Craig Manton, will provide a report on the Council's activities over the last 12 months. Significant outcomes of the parent and staff surveys, which were conducted late in 2017, will be shared with parents.

Another feature of the evening will be a presentation on cyber safety for children, delivered by an expert in the field.

All parents are encouraged to attend. The P & C will be providing light refreshments on the night.

Several School Council Representatives will complete their tenures after the public meeting. Parents and staff are urged to nominate for the vacancies that will arise as a consequence. They include one Early Childhood Representative, two General Parent Representatives, a P & C Representative and one Staff Representative. Nominations will be called for, and elections conducted, early in Term 2

A student survey will be conducted with Year 5 and 6 students in the final weeks of the term to gauge their levels of satisfaction, enjoyment and comfort at school. This is a component of the National Schools Opinion Surveys which are mandated by the Commonwealth Government, to be conducted at least every two years. Students were last surveyed in 2014.

#### **First Aid Lessons**

Commencing on Monday next week, all classes from Kindergarten to Year 6 will participate in a First Aid lesson appropriate to their level of development. The program, First Aid Focus, will be delivered by St John Ambulance and allows students to learn the importance of first aid skills in an enjoyable and age appropriate manner. It will culminate in a visit from an ambulance on Thursday the 29<sup>th</sup> March.

## PARKING REMINDERS



#### **Parking**

Parking is a perennial problem at most schools as there never seems to be enough space for the number of people needing to leave their cars whilst delivering or collecting children to and from class or visiting the school for other reasons.

The only designated parking area for all parents is adjacent to the Early Learning Centre. If you are delivering or collecting your primary aged child/ren, I encourage you to consider using the Loop Drop-off area in Amherst Avenue. Some parents may be anxious about their child proceeding unaccompanied to or from class. I can assure you, they do this without issue at every recess and lunch break throughout the day. There is always a teacher on duty at the Loop after school (until 3.25 pm), when the volume of traffic in this area is at its height.

Another alternative, particularly for older children, is to drop them off or meet them in the car park at the Railway Reserve near the Post Office. Please avoid the bays closest to the Post Office.

Parents are reminded not to park in the designated staff car parks at the Early Learning Centre, behind the Covered Assembly Area off Glen Road or in the car park off Amherst Avenue, near the office.

#### **Easter Break**

Next Friday, the 30th March, the school will close for the traditional Easter Holiday. Parents are reminded that the Tuesday after Easter is a Public Service Holiday and so the school will remain closed.


