#### **NAPLAN**

The National Assessment Program in Literacy and Numeracy will be conducted on Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday (15th, 16th and 17th May), with a catch-up day on Friday 18th May for students who were absent for any of the tests. All students in Years 3 and 5 are expected to participate.

The tests provide parents and schools with an understanding of how individual students are performing at the time of the tests. NAPLAN tests are just one aspect of the school's assessment and reporting process; they do not replace ongoing assessments made by teachers about student performance.

You can help your child prepare for NAPLAN by reassuring them that the tests are just one part of their school program and by reminding them on the day to simply try their best. Teachers will ensure students are familiar with the types of questions in the tests and will provide appropriate support and guidance.






