School Development Day

Last Monday, while you were all enjoying an additional day of school holidays, the staff were here working hard.

The day was spent exploring Explicit Instruction, which is teacher-centred instruction that is focused on clear behavioural and cognitive goals and outcomes which, in turn, are made 'explicit' or transparent to learners. This methodology is mandated by the Department of Education, for implementation in every classroom.

Mrs Hill and Ms Adam recently attended a two day workshop at Haileybury College in Melbourne, which is one of Australia's leading proponents of this style of teaching. They shared the observations and information gained from their visit and guided staff members in preparing appropriate resource for use in their classrooms. I have already seen the outcomes from this session in action in classrooms.

Cross Country

I was very impressed with the endeavour and gritty determination on display last Friday when students from Pre-primary to Year 6 participated in the annual Faction Cross Country Carnival. It is one sporting event where everyone who participates earns points for their team.

Congratulations to Blue Faction who were victorious on the day, with their captains, Declan and Nikki, proudly hoisting the 89 year old *Darlington School Athletic Cup* on behalf of their team. The cup was presented to the school by the residents of Darlington, in 1929, for annual competition in athletics between school factions.

The first four place getters in each race from Years 4-6 will now go on to represent the school at the annual Hills Education Community Sports Association Cross country Carnival. It will be held at the Mundaring Recreation Grounds on Thursday 16^{th} August.


Head Lice Check

Please be aware we have had some recent cases of head lice. Please check your children and treat if necessary.

Children with head lice are required to have their hair cleared of lice before returning to school.

This can be achieved by using an insecticide product purchased from the local pharmacy and used according to the manufacturer's instruction. This must be followed by physically removing the lice from the hair after the recommended time period using a special nit comb.

Hair will need to be checked on a daily basis for the following 10 days to ensure that all lice and eggs have been removed from the hair. Refer to the Department of Health, head lice fact sheet at www.public.health.wa.gov.au


