Dear Parents and Care givers

We have certainly experienced an action packed last fortnight, since the last newsletter, and the action continues.

Science Week

Last week, we celebrated National Science Week, which has become a very significant event on the school's program each year.

Huge inflatable dinosaurs, rockets, exploding Mentos, elephant's toothpaste, secret potions, dancing Gummy Bears and foil boats were among the scientific phenomena that kept the students from Kindergarten to Year 6 spellbound on Friday. The annual Science Day lived up to expectations, as students explored a wide range of aweinspiring science experiments and activities. In particular, thanks go to Mr Smith and Senor Sabattini for planning and co-ordinating the day. We were particularly privileged to have guest presenters Heath Dullard, from Ellenbrook Secondary College, and Paul Stanwix, from the University of WA, who both captivated the students with their amazing demonstrations about energy and physics.

It was a loud, but memorable, event.

On Wednesday, the Year 6 Science Team of Jaxon D, Ella K, Mika P and Emily S, competed in the HEC Interschool Science Challenge at Sawyers Valley Primary school. Students from 11 local primary schools worked with their teams to solve a number of scientific challenges. The Darlington team finished a very creditable 3rd in the competition.

Cross Country

Congratulations to the Interschool Cross Country Team and their coach, Ms Bloomer, on their outstanding effort in winning the HEC Cross Country Carnival last Thursday. It was a wonderful team effort that saw Darlington placed first in 4 out of the 8 events and in the first 4 places in all but one of the remaining races. This was just reward for all of their training and endeavour in the lead up to the event.

Year 6 Camp

This time two weeks ago, the Year 6 students were enjoying camp at Point Peron Camp School. They were confronted with numerous challenges and team building situations, including: Rock Wall climbing; Prusiking (vertical rope climbing); low ropes course; Laser Tag (at which a team of students beat the teachers!); ferrying one another across an expanse of concrete floor on small skate boards with only a rope for assistance; the now infamous Woodley's Wild Beach Walk; and, of course, the customary table etiquette lesson.

The students acquitted themselves amazingly well and returned home on the Friday afternoon tired, but well fed, and with many special memories.

Thank you to Mr Scott, Mr Smith, Miss Beeson and Tracey (School Chaplain) for giving up their time to enable our valedictory class to enjoy this very special activity.

Year 7 Transition

On Thursday 23rd August, all of the Year 6 students, accompanied by their teachers, will have their first taste of secondary school, when they go across to Kalamunda Senior High School for a Transition Day. This event is presented and sponsored by Kalamunda Senior High School. Other local secondary schools will host their incoming students at transition activities later in the year.

Book Week

Another highlight on the school's calendar is the annual Book Character Parade which will be conducted this Friday, 24th August. No doubt many families have already been engaged in planning and constructing their incredible costumes. The Admin Team have been plotting and stitching for several weeks and some of the outcomes promise to be remarkable.

The parade will be held in the Covered Assembly Area, commencing at 9.00 am.

Following on immediately after Book Week will be the Book Fair which will be held in the Library. See details later in this newsletter. Thank you to Mrs Diaz for arranging the event.

NAPLAN Online

From 2019, all Western Australian government schools will complete NAPLAN On-line testing. This will involve Year 3 and 5 students next year.

In preparation for the change-over to online testing, the School Curriculum and Standards Authority has arranged School Readiness Testing to be conducted during the period 20th August to the 7th September. To comply with this requirement, our current Year 3 and 5 students will participate in simulated tests on Monday and Tuesday next week. The tests will be completed in class, on laptops, under the supervision of class teachers. As the purpose of the exercise is to test the school's and the wider system's capacity to cope with the demands of large scale testing, the tests will not be marked and so no results will be available.

School Council

Outcomes of the School Council meeting held last Tuesday evening were:

- The teaching of Italian for classes from Years 3 6 will be phased in, in place of French, over the next 3 years. By 2019, Italian will be the only language delivered. In the interim, those students who have already begun learning French will continue to do so for the remainder of their time at this school.
- The Council will tender a submission in opposition to the proposed new runway at Perth airport.
- In lieu of a whole school parent survey this year, only parents of departing students will be asked to complete the National Schools Opinion Survey. Next year, invitations to complete the anonymous survey online will be incorporated into 3 Way Conferences in Term 3.
- A proposal to offer a dedicated Digital Literacy Class, where parents choose to fund the lease of a laptop for their child, is being explored. Further information will be available early in Term 4.
- This year's Semester 2 reports will be made available to parents electronically. Further details will be provided in Term 4.

And so the busy times roll on.




