# FOR CHANGE

Darlington Primary School (DPS) is a *Containers for Change* drop off location.

When you drop off your eligible containers to DPS we receive a 10c refund for each container. This money will go towards funding further sustainability projects within our school.

There is a **RED BIN** near the front office where you can bring your cleaned eligible containers.

## Drumming Group




Drumming Group starts Thursday March 4. This is for students in pre-primary to year 6. We meet Thursday from 3.00pm to 3.30pm.
