



The role of the Chaplain is to be a listening ear for the whole school community.

Referrals to see the Chaplain

I have a letter box in the office where students may refer themselves.

Students are able to self-refer to see me or can be referred by teachers, parents, admin or the Student Services team. I will also run small groups for students who may need assistance with friendships and self-esteem as referred by admin, staff or teachers.

I am also here as a resource for you as parents. Sometimes, a friendly listening ear is vital. It is important for you to feel heard by someone.

Just a reminder that a Chaplain – is not a teacher and does not teach religious education.

Programs

I also run varies programs throughout the year. Some of the programs are-

Craft Group - runs in the library during the second half of lunch on Thursdays. This is for students in Years 1 to 6.

Girls Group - is open to girls in Year 3 to 6. We meet Monday lunchtimes in the undercover area. A permission form is required.

Drumming Club - is open for students in Pre-primary to Year 6. This is on Thursday afterschool from 3.00 pm to 3.30 pm in the undercover area. A permission form is required.

Drama Club - is open for students in Years 1 to 6. A permission form is required.

What happens in a session with the Chaplain?

When a student comes in for a chat I will always let them know-

Most of the things we talk about should stay private between us.

But things involving you or other people being hurt are things I may need to talk to someone else about.

I will always explain this to you and try to involve you in deciding how we do this.

Each session is different and individual for the student, they may just want to talk about how they are feeling or what is going on for them, we might go for a walk, they might draw or colour in. There are times when we might play a game of Uno or Jenga, I find over this student will talk as well.

If there are any concerns, then I will talk to the Principal or Deputy Principal, and we will work out the solution for the best interest of the student.

If you do not want your child to see the Chaplain or be involved in any small groups, please provide this in writing.
